Profile: Susan Henshaw Jones

President of the South Street Seaport Museum

Susan Henshaw Jones is Ronay Menschel Director and President of the Museum of the City of New York and has recently assumed the additional role of President of the South Street Seaport Museum. From 1994-2002 she served as Director of the National Building Museum in Washington DC, the nation's leading institution devoted to tracing and interpreting American achievement in architecture, construction, engineering, and design. Ms. Jones was President of the New York Landmarks Conservancy from 1988 to 1994.

Joining the Museum of the City of New York marked a return to New York, for Susan began her career working in the Lindsay Administration in the Mayor's Office of Lower Manhattan Development. She has also worked for the Boston Housing Authority, Citibank, and, for a period following attending business school, helped run her family's manufacturing company.



Ms. Jones serves on the Board of Rochdale Investments and is a member of the Trustees Council of the New York Landmarks Conservancy and the Historic House Trust of New York City. She is a fellow of the New York Academy of History. Ms. Jones attended Vassar College where she received a B.A. in English Literature and she

received her MBA from Columbia University's Graduate School of Business in 1985.
