Profile: Capt John Krevey and Pier 63/66

The Birthplace of the Working Harbor Committee

Capt John Krevey is a hero to many – boaters of all kinds, historic ship owners, kayakers, maritime lovers, excursion boat and water taxi operators, artists, musicians, tall ships and schooners, homeless sailors, Hawai’ian outrigger canoe enthusiasts, water polo players, local block and park associations, not-for-profit organizations of all kinds, dancers from Tango to Salsa to disco, marching bands, modern dance groups, jazz-lovers, theatricals, and thousands upon thousands of residents of NYC who have been coming down to his converted railroad car-float to relax, have drinks and great food, unwind and get close to the water.

John Krevey’s Pier 63 Maritime, which became Pier 66 Maritime after its move to Pier 66A (the restored RR float bridge and the end of West 26th Street) was one of the best kept secrets on the West Side of Manhattan for many years. It was also the home of the first National Maritime Day Festivals hosted by the Working Harbor Committee - a free day-long celebration of all things maritime with Hidden Harbor boat tours of New York and New Jersey’s maritime waterfront, plus exhibits, music and festivities. Literally, Krevey’s barge was the birthplace of this organization.

The barge (often mistakenly called a pier) is also home to the historic lightship Frying Pan and the retired famous fireboat John J. Harvey, both on the National Record of Historic Places. It is also adorned with a variety of sculpture, paintings, found objects, antiques and maritime or other artifacts. Today it is one of the most popular spots in Manhattan from after 5 to midnight for sunset viewing and good cheer.

Capt John Krevey, certified “Hero of the Harbor” (Metropolitan Waterfront Alliance) and NYC Council Proclamation Holder (Hon. Chris Quinn, City Council Speaker), and friend to literally thousands, will be honored by the Working Harbor Committee at a special Sizzlin’ September Party on 21 September from 6 to 8 pm at (where else) Pier 66 maritime. The award will be presented by Sr.VP NYC EDC Maritime, Venetia Lannon. “It’s about time” said WHC Executive Director Capt John Doswell. “He was waterfront when waterfront wasn’t cool”.
