Profile: Bernie Ente WHC Photographer and Steering Committee Member



Bernard Ente is a professional photographer living in New York City. His interest in ships and shipping developed at an early age, as the family's Manhattan business was located near the busy Hudson River piers. Bernard's father, a former U. S. Merchant Marine officer, fully explained the activity during visits to the waterfront. As Bernard's photography career evolved, he developed close relationships with many local railroads and charter boat companies. With an interest in local history, in the 1990's he began to host tours of the port and major terminals. Combining his knowledge of photography with historical aspects, his tours are very popular. Events have included walking tours, bus and boat charters, and even a private train. Bernard's images covering the area's waterways, maritime industry, railroads, bridges, and tourist attractions have appeared in many publications, on the Internet, and a U.S. postage stamp. A proud member of the Working Harbor Committee, Bernard has hosted many specialty tours for the organization.

with 10 more
stamp designs
that feature the
Stars and Stripes
plus the states of
Montana
through North Dakota .



In addition to the flag art, each stamp design includes artwork that provides a "snapshot view" of the state or other area represented by a particular flag. In most cases, an everyday scene or activity is shown, but occasionally the view is of something less commonplace-rare wildlife, perhaps, or a stunning vista. Unlike some previous multi-stamp issuances, this series is not limited to official animals, flowers, or products, nor is it meant to showcase well-known buildings, landmarks, or monuments.
