The tour will go over to Kill Van Kull (between Staten Island & Bayonne) passing by oil docks, tug yards and drydocks, then will pass by Shooter's Island (former shipyard, now a bird sanctuary), the New York Container Terminal, south through Arthur Kill past the graveyard of ships at Witte's and Fresh Kills landfill (former giant garbage site, now being developed as parkland), more ship terminals, Tottenville at the southern tip, then north up the east side of SI and Stapleton, the former US Navy Home Port, the home of FDNY fireboat Firefighter, Miller's Launch and on back to Pier 17, passing by Robbin's Reef lighthouse, the back channel by Military Ocean Terminal and Global Container terminal, Greenville RR Yards and, finally, the Statue of Liberty.

A little history about *W.O. Decker*:

Net Tonnage: 18 **Length:** 52 ft. (overall) **Breadth:** 15 ft. **Depth:** 5.6 ft. **Horsepower:** 175 **Draft:** 6 The wooden tugboat *W.O. Decker* was built in Long Island City, Queens in 1930 for the Newtown Creek Towing Company, a firm specializing in berthing ships and barges in the creek that separates Brooklyn and Queens. Originally called the *Russell I* for the towing company's owners, she was renamed the *W.O. Decker* in 1946 after being sold to the Decker family's Staten Island tugboat firm. One of the last steam-powered tugs built in this harbor, she was later refitted with a diesel engine. In 1986, the *W.O. Decker* was donated to the Seaport Museum, where she works at diverse tasks, from daily waterfront maintenance to private charters. </div>

Profile: Capt. Jerry Roberts - Member of the Working Harbor Committee

Capt. Jerry Roberts, WHC Steering Committee member, was, for many years, curator of the Intrepid Sea*Air*Space Museum. While there, 18 years ago, he started the Great North River Tugboat Race & Competition. He was also the captain of the museum's tug Hackensack. He left the museum about 6 years ago to become the Executive Director of the Lighthouse Museum on Staten Island and became a member of the WHC. At that time he brought the tugboat race to WHC, which has produced it ever since, but with Jerry still at the helm. Today Jerry heads the Connecticut River Museum, but returns to NYC every year to announce and

judge the annual race he started. This year's event will be on 5 September. With fair tides, the event that he started 18 years ago will continue for many years.

Sunday 5 September, 2010 - Pier 84, North River - Hudson River Park, NYC, NY

As always a spectator boat will be offered

10am - Parade of tugs from Pier 84 to the start line near 79th Street Boat Basin.

10:30am - Race starts - From 79th Street Boat Basin to Pier 84 - one nautical mile.

11am - Nose to nose pushing contests and line toss competition.

Noon - Tugs tie up to Pier 84 for lunch (for tug crews) and awards ceremony, to which all are invited

1pm - Awards ceremony. Tugs depart at about 2 PM.

ALL DAY - Exhibits on the pier from maritime organizations, the towing industry, maritime museums, USCG, PANYNJ and other maritime government organizations. Plus activities for kids, maritime skill demos, music and more.
