On 2 October 2010, just after sunset, several boats and numerous spectators gathered at the Battery in lower Manhattan for the first NYC Toot'N Blink concert of boats horns & lights. Concieved by composer Charlie Morrow, and produced by WHC Executive Director John Doswell, the event was part of a week-long series of retrospective Charlie concerts. Vessels in the concert included *NY Waterway*, *New York Water Taxi*, the schooner *Adirondack*, MWA's *Big G*, USCG AUX vessel *Lady B*, the Seaport Museum's *W. O. Decker*, FDNY fireboat *Kevin Kane* and *SAILTIME*

27 skippered by WHC's Capt Jonathan Atkin. The event was broadcast on WFMU with onsite announcers Ed Herrmann and Joan LaBarbara. With luck, the event may be repeated in London and Helsinki as well as other port cities - but, in any event it will be back again in NYC next year bigger & better.
