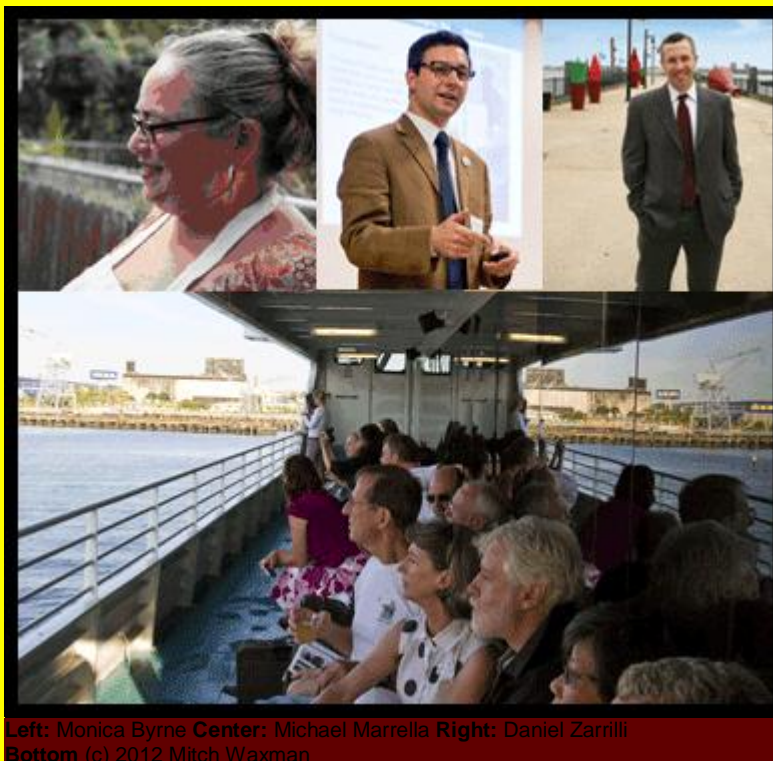

Explores New York Harbor in the Wake of Hurricane Sandy**

Special Guest Speakers:

Michael Marrella AICP, is the Director of Waterfront and Open Space Planning for the New York City Department of City Planning. Michael is responsible for directing waterfront policy for the agency. He advises the Chair and members of the City Planning Commission on the planning and land use issues affecting waterfront and open space areas and climate adaptation planning, manages the staff of the Waterfront and Open Space Division, and acts as the primary liaison to a wide range of stakeholders including elected officials, community organizations, and private sector entities on matters of land use, zoning and economic development related to waterfront and open space.

Daniel Zarrilli is the Director of Resiliency for the City of New York. Mayor Bloomberg appointed Dan to this newly created position in June 2013 to lead the implementation of the City's PlaNYC resiliency report: "A Stronger, More Resilient New York." Until June 2013, he served on the Mayor's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency, leading the City's efforts to develop coastal protection measures for the five boroughs. In a previous role, he was the Senior Vice President for Asset Management at NYCEDC, responsible for maritime assets and operations, including the City's two cruise terminals and numerous other transportation and freight assets.

Monica Byrne, co-founder of ReStore Red Hook (restoredredhook.org), will talk about the coalition of small businesses who banded together in the neighborhood of Red Hook to raise funds to rebuild in the horrific aftermath of Hurricane Sandy. Monica, along with her partner Leisah Swenson, also co-own Home/Made, a restaurant in Red Hook, that suffered extensive damage after Sandy. The restaurant just recently re-opened their doors. They are also partners of Roquette Catering, a boutique event design company. (homemadebklyn.com)

Capt John. Doswell, Executive Director of the Working Harbor Committee, will moderate the discussion and act as tour guide, pointing out places of interest as the boat passes by them.

Hurricane Sandy brought high seas to New York's inner harbor, flooding streets and buildings, engulfing subway tunnels, shorting out power stations and paralyzing waterfront neighborhoods. New York was unprepared. The question everyone has asked since then is: What can we do better?

This tour is part of a series of "Beyond Sandy" Tours that the nonprofit Working Harbor, renowned for its Hidden Harbor tours of the working harbor, added to its 2013 tour schedule. "Our goal is to show people the city's waterfront firsthand so they can understand the impacts of climate change and learn how we can prepare for rising waters," said Capt. John Doswell. Hidden Harbor® and Beyond Sandy Tours are presented by the nonprofit Working Harbor Committee in partnership with the New York Water Taxi/Circle Line Downtown.
